Saturday Lapping Day Open to:

Current SCCBC Racing Members who have held valid Race licenses in the past year and Closed Wheel Race Cars with recent tech stickers or log books showing recent tech.

Sunday Lapping Day Open to:

Current SCCBC Racing Members who have held valid Race licenses in the past year and Open Wheel Race Cars with recent tech stickers or log books showing recent tech. Closed wheel cars will be accepted on a standby basis if we do not get the full quota of open wheel.

PADDOCK SPACES ARE NOT ASSIGNED – stagger and leave at least one open pad between occupied spaces.

SCCBC has the right to refuse any driver or car. Accepted entries will receive a self-tech form to be completed and emailed before arriving at the track, and instructions regarding waivers. CACC annual waiver is preferred.

Restrictions: No passengers. Vehicle sound level limit 95db.

Gates: 7:30 AM – Mandatory Drivers' Meeting in pre-grid 8:30 AM – First Group on Track 9:00 AM (depending on entries there may be two groups which will rotate every 20 minutes)

Notice to Participants: In light of the current COVID-19 situation, every attempt will be made to minimize the risks of exposure to the virus. New processes and procedures are being developed and will be put into place for events going forward. Drivers and Crews are required to bring masks and wear them at the drivers' meeting and at any time when they are in close proximity to anyone who is not in their household.
